

Proverbs 25. 6-7

⁶ Do not put yourself forward in the king's presence or stand in the place of the great;

⁷ for it is better to be told, 'Come up here', than to be put lower in the presence of a noble.

Ecclesiasticus 10. 12-18

¹² The beginning of human pride is to forsake the Lord; the heart has withdrawn from its Maker.

The Government is testing the UK's Emergency Alerts system. Emergency Alerts is a UK government system that provides warning and advice in a life threatening emergency. Your phone or tablet may make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent, or vibrate or read out the alert. The sound and vibration will last for about 10 seconds. The Government do not need to know your number to activate the alert!

The wicked see it and are angry they gnash their teeth and melt away; the desire of the wicked comes to nothing.

Luke 14. 1, 7-14

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely. When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honour, he told them a parable. ⁸ When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honour, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, "Give this person your place", and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. ¹⁰ But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher"; then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. ¹¹ For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted. ¹² He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your heathers or your relatives or rich paighbours. in case brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. ¹³ But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. ¹⁴ And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'
